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PROGRAM DETAILS

Saskatchewan Communities in Bloom Program Response to Health and Safety:

The Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association (SPRA) is committed to the safety of our staff, volunteers and communities. Therefore, participants of the Program should be aware of the following:

- All Communities in Bloom activities must adhere to all Government of Saskatchewan Public Health and Safety orders and are expected to provide a safe environment for those involved.
- Community Evaluations may be cancelled in response to new Public Health and Safety orders and SPRA's organizational COVID-19 Mitigation Measures. If evaluations are cancelled, reimbursement options will be offered.

Participant Type:

Communities in Bloom is a program suitable for any type of community based participant.

1. Urban Municipality – Includes Cities, Towns, Villages, Northern Villages, Resort Villages and Northern Hamlets.
2. Community – Includes Organized Hamlets, Northern Settlements, Resort Hamlets, Unorganized Hamlets, Resort Communities, First Nations, Métis Communities, Special Service Areas and other community areas.
3. Rural Municipalities (R.M.) – Intended for R.M.s that wish to participate with their entire municipal area, including R.M. governed communities but excluding Urban Municipalities within R.M. borders.
4. Communities in Bloom Places and Spaces – Intended for non-municipal participants that are interested in Communities in Bloom's values and support. This non-competitive category may be evaluated or non-evaluated and includes a unique evaluation specifically developed for this category. Participants may include: Senior/Long Term Care Facilities, Park Authorities, Museum Facilities, Residential Complexes, Private Subdivisions and other non-municipal groups. Evaluated Participants are recognized for Bloom Achievement.

Category Selection for the Urban Municipality, Community and Rural Municipality Participants:

1. Competitive – Communities compete within their population categories and are evaluated based on all criteria areas of Communities in Bloom. This category provides the opportunity to progress to the national competition.
2. Novice – For new participants or those that have not been evaluated since 2019, a non-competitive evaluation in three criteria areas of the participant's choosing is completed and a Bloom Rating is awarded. This includes a program consult at the participant's request. This category is intended for a single year of participation and registrants are encouraged to enter another evaluated CiB Category in future years.
3. Evaluated Friends – Communities experience a non-competitive evaluation of an effort to build community pride, gain knowledge, track community progress. Participants are recognized for Bloom Achievement.

Note: Competitive, Novice and Evaluated Friends participants must prepare for a one day evaluation to take place during July or August and provide a night's lodging and a meal (typically lunch during the evaluation) for each judge (if requested).

4. Friends (non-evaluated) – Recognized for their participation, participants do not receive a Bloom Rating and are not visited by the judges. This category is recognized for participation only.
5. Tourist's Takeaway – What would a tourist see when visiting your community? Using a customized evaluation grid, Communities in Bloom judges will visit the community unannounced in July or August. There will be no in-person contact with the judges. Participants are recognized for Bloom Achievement.

Participant Responsibilities are to:

- Appreciate the Communities in Bloom judges as they are volunteers focussed on helping you.
- Provide photographs, articles and detailed descriptions of projects to support the promotion of the program.
