






- Collaborative effort led by the Canadian Parks Council (CPC) and the Canadian Parks and Recreation Association (CPRA) since 2015
 - Informed by a multi-sector National Advisory Committee
 - Engaged a broad cross-section of the Canadian parks community throughout a 3draft process which included the Canadian Parks Summit (April, 2016), Canadian Parks Conference (March, 2017), online engagement (Spring, 2017), and a fall 2017 feedback process within the CPC and CPRA.
- Parks for All is a uniting document that enables the parks community to share and collaborate on strategic directions and actions for a sustainable future.

CPC members manage:

- 10.5% of Canada's land and fresh water
- 2,600+ parks & protected areas






CPRA members:

- The CPC, CPRA and dozens of Canadian parks community member organizations are committed partners to the Canadian #NatureForAll coalition.






