



## Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association 2025 Future Leaders Scholarship Program

The Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association (SPRA) is committed to supporting the next generation of recreation and parks leaders, and is focused on growing diversity, perspective, and contributions in the industry.

The SPRA Future Leaders Scholarship will support a diverse group of talented Saskatchewan youth to thrive academically and professionally. We believe everyone has a right to an education, and we are committed to providing those experiencing barriers to education the opportunity to apply for scholarship funding to advance their education/training in the field of recreation and parks.

### Concept/Intent:

- To provide post-secondary funding for youth (ages 18–30) experiencing barriers to educational attainment.
- To support the training of youth as professionals that will advance parks and recreation priorities in Saskatchewan.
- To ensure the recreation industry remains a relevant and attractive employment option.
- Highlight the successes of a diverse group of future parks and recreation leaders.

### Scholarship Amount:

Up to \$3,000 per approved application.

### Deadline:

Monday, March 31, 2025, at 5 p.m.

### Submissions:

### Eligibility:

Submissions will only be considered if the following criteria are met. The applicant must be:

- A resident of Saskatchewan.
- Between the ages of 18 and 30 as of December 31, 2025.
- Enrolled in full-time or part-time post-secondary studies through a [recognized or registered Canadian educational institution](#) in 2025, with a program focus on any of the following: recreation, community development, active living, tourism, horticulture, or recreation facility management.
- A Canadian citizen, permanent resident or a protected person as defined by the [Immigration and Refugee Protection Act](#).
- Have a current Social Insurance Number (SIN).

Saskatchewan residents pursuing an education outside of the province are eligible.



SPRA will prioritize the Application of youth who experience barriers to education or employment. These include, but are not limited to, those who self-identify as:

- Black.
- Indigenous.
- Person of colour.
- 2SLGBTQI+.
- Women.
- Person living with a disability (visible or invisible).
- Living in a low-income household.
- Living with family care responsibilities.
- Living with low levels of literacy and/or numeracy.
- Residing in a rural or remote geographical location.
- A protected person as defined by the [Immigration and Refugee Protection Act](#).

#### Submission Requirements:

- Submit a complete application form.
- Submit answers to interview questions.
- Submit proof of enrollment.
- Recent photograph(s) (encouraged, but not required).

**Note - By submitting this Application Form, applicants agree to provide SPRA approval to use content of successful submissions, in whole or in part, on SPRA communication platforms.**

#### Selection of Recipients:

Following the deadline, a committee will review and consider all submitted Applications. Approved applicants will be notified of their success by April 30, 2025.

**Note:** The successful applicants will be requested and required to provide their SIN for taxation purposes.

*Per question: minimum 100 words, max 350 words*

Personal motivation:

- What have been your personal motivations for pursuing an education in this field and what are your career goals for the five to ten years following completion of your education?

Knowledge of the industry:

- What do you see as opportunities for growth and development for the recreation and parks industry in Saskatchewan?

Barriers to career development:

- What barriers have you faced in achieving your educational and career pursuits and what can be done to ease these challenges?

Impact of scholarship:

- Please let us know why you should be chosen to receive this scholarship. How will it impact your life?

Responses to the scholarship interview questions can be submitted as a written, audio or video file. Acceptable formats include Microsoft Word (or equivalent), PDF, MP3, or MP4.



Alternative submission options may be considered on a case-by-case basis. Email [scholarship@spra.sk.ca](mailto:scholarship@spra.sk.ca) to request accommodations.

Accompanying photographs, in JPEG format, including a recent photo of the applicant and photos that support the application are highly encouraged.
